**The Annual Parish Meeting of Hildersham to be held on Tuesday 9th May 2023, in Hildersham Village Hall.**

**Meeting started at 7.20pm**

**Present: Mark Logan, Rob Clay, Darren Long, David Mercer, John and Henry Batchelor, one member of the public and the Clerk.**

- 1. Apologies for absence** were received and accepted by the councillors unanimously from Billie.
- 2. Approval of the Minutes** of the Parish Meeting held on 10<sup>th</sup> May 2022 was unanimous from all councillors.
- 3. Actions from the last meeting** – there were no actions.
- 4. Report from the Chair of the Parish Council for 2022/23-** The Chairman Mark Logan had circulated his report to all councillors.
- 5. Report from District Councillor and County Councillor Henry Batchelor-** the report had circulated his report to all councillors. Major items included changes along the A1307, including the completion of the new crossing at Hildersham being well received. The next project was to complete the cycleway towards Linton, while the cycleway project to Abington was being revisited due to costs. A temporary road would be built to by-pass work being done on the Bartlow crossroads. The proposed congestion charge consultation for Cambridge to fund additional public transport would be made public in June. Pothole repair will be done during warmer weather. Drivers can make a claim for damage due to potholes.
- 6. Report from District Councillors John Batchelor** - the report had circulated his report to all councillors. There are over 800 Ukrainian refugees are living in the District, getting help with housing, with 400 hosted by residents with support from the District Council services. More people were still arriving. David Mercer asked for the District Councillors' support as there had been no reply about the Back Road LHI bid, despite 3 emails to Josh and Bradley. The more complex bids were to be assessed this week.
